Cherry Berries on a Cloud

Family favorite

INGREDIENTS:

- 6 egg whites
- 1/2 tsp cream of tartar
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1 3/4 c sugar

COOKERY:

FILLING:

- 2 (3 ounce) cream cheese
- 1 c sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 c heavy cream, whipped
- 2 c miniature marshmallows

TOPPING:

- 1 tsp lemon juice
- 1 (21 ounce) cherry filling
- 2 c sliced fresh strawberries

1. Beat egg whites, cream of tartar and salt until foamy. Gradually add sugar, 1 tsp at a time, beating on high until stiff peaks form. Spread evenly in a greased 13-in. x 9-in. x 2-in. baking pan. Bake at 275 degrees for 1 hour; turn off oven (do not open door). Let cool in oven overnight or at least 12 hours.

2. Beat cream cheese, sugar and vanilla until smooth; gently fold in whipped cream and marshmallows. Spread over meringue. Chill for 4 hours. Cut into 16 pieces. Combine topping ingredients; spoon 1/4 cup over each serving.

WE HAVE OUR LOYAL MEMBERS AND EMPLOYEES TO THANK FOR IT!

Following the depression in 1937 ten employees from Mountain Bell organized their first meeting of the Credit Union on December 10th. They formed a federal credit union that was limited to Mountain Bell employees. Mrs. Stella Snyder was elected as the first President of a five member Board. There was a \$5.00 share requirement; loans were limited to \$100.00 secured, \$50.00 unsecured with interest at 1% per month.

In 1984, we merged with Albuquerque Publishing Company FCU, which brought in 550 members. In 1985, we merged with Employment Security Department CU, adding another 700 members. In 1986, we participated in a forced merged with Tijeras

FCU, adding 125 members. In 1986, the credit union changed its name to the more generic First Financial of New Mexico FCU, done to reflect the increasing diversity of the membership.

First Financial has been around for 75 years, and we have our loyal members and employees to thank for it! Loretta Trujillo has been an employee with First Financial for 35 years! She was hired in 1978 as a teller (when she was all of 22 years old), and held many different job titles throughout the years, including the title of the best three point shooter on the credit union's basketball team! Today Loretta is the VP of Member Relations, and both members and employees have become family to her. Loretta loves working for First Financial, "The idea of people helping people made me love working for a credit union," she said.



At First Financial Credit Union we strive to make sure that our members come FIRST. Peggy Blackburn and her husband James, have been members of First Financial for many years. Her husband James worked for the phone company, and opened his account in 1946! We look forward to serving our current and new members for many years to come. TIPS ON MAKING YOUR NEW VEHICLE PURCHASE A GOOD DECISION

A MESSAGE FROM FFCU'S PRESIDENT BEN HEYWARD

As many of you know the Great Recession has prompted many Americans to hold on to their vehicles longer than normal. Now that many of us are beginning to see some improvement in our overall financial future, car buying is beginning to increase. Sometimes however, being bitten by the "new car bug" can blind our judgment when it comes to what is the best vehicle to buy. So, I share some tips on how you might avoid mistakes commonly made when buying a new vehicle.

NEGLECTING TO PERFORM A THOROUGH TEST DRIVE: Don't be guilty of "Love at First Sight" by assuming that a vehicle drives as good as it looks. Take your time test driving it. Take it on the highway, as well as city streets. If you have children, take them along as well to ensure they are comfortable in it. Check for visibility, maneuverability, acceleration and overall driving ease.

SELECT THE OPTIONS AND FEATURES YOU REALLY WANT AND NEED: Do you need navigation? If you tend to use your phone while driving you may insist on the vehicle having automatic cell phone "hands free" connectivity. Does it have cup holders? If you haul children or pets on a regular basis you may want to think twice about the expense of leather seats. What about towing packages and models with extra cargo space? Is a diesel engine the right choice for you?

BUYING EXTENDED WARRANTIES: Dealers offer legitimate extended warranties, but do you really need them? Remember, new vehicles and many used ones come with warranties when you purchase them. However if you are purchasing a vehicle that doesn't have a warranty, First Financial has some affordable options. We offer lower cost, premium protection plans that will provide you protection against mechanical breakdowns beyond your existing manufacturer's warranty.
